1. Robotic Process Automation Platforms

Robotic process automation (RPA) platforms are efficient tools for automating workflows, but only to a certain extent. RPA is proficient when working with highly-structured data and rules-based processes that require limited human interaction. 3. AWS

The [AWS](#) suite of solutions automates customer workflows. AWS Config, for instance, provides continuous tracking of changes to your AWS resources to ensure you achieve your desired configurations. 4. Zapier

[Zapier](#) is a no-code integration hub that empowers folks to connect services and processes with one another quickly and easily. It takes away the time and challenges of building one-off integrations from code-based API platforms, and puts the power to automate workflows into the hands of those managing the processes. 5. Google Data Studio

Workflow automation tools must be versatile and simple. Retrieving data from several sources and presenting it in a clear manner is crucial to convey critical information.

6. Nintex

[Nintex](#) offers advanced process management, workflow automation and robotic process automation (RPA) capabilities. It seamlessly integrates with business applications such as SAP, Salesforce, Microsoft Dynamics and legacy systems. -

7. Microsoft Azure

I would recommend the cloud services from well-known manufacturers—for example, [Microsoft Azure](#), a cloud-based platform to host enterprise and hybrid infrastructure. 8. Marketo

Drip campaigns can benefit any business. They allow you to onboard new clients, reengage inactive leads and reward your loyal users. But drip campaigns can take a lot of work to set up and implement. 10. QuickBooks Online

A great tool to automate your business accounting and bookkeeping is [QuickBooks Online](#) (QBO), which links to your bank accounts and credit/debit cards to instantaneously and automatically update your books in the cloud. 11. Bubble

I like [Bubble](#), which lets you build pretty complex web apps without really coding. Stitching together blocks and tables to make something that works for folks who don't code. 12. Parashift

Automating workflow is essential to productivity. [Parashift](#) is a tech tool I recommend for automating paper workflows—such as invoices, bills, purchase orders, etc. It's like having a fully autonomous document processing system with you everywhere—and one that doesn't have to be physically located at your office. 13. Nexenta

A simple yet effective tool for automating digital files and ensuring security is [Nexenta](#). 14. Any Tool That Eliminates Monotonous, Repetitive Tasks

Entrepreneurs don't realize how much time and money repetitive tasks waste.
